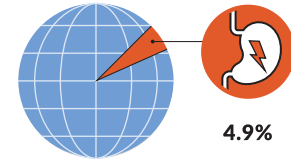

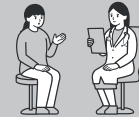

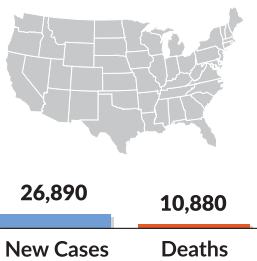

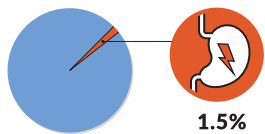

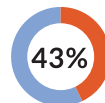


Stomach Cancer makes up only **1.5%** of Cancer Cases in the U.S.

12-14X Incidence Rate for Korean Americans vs. White Americans (Highest Among All Americans)⁽⁶⁾

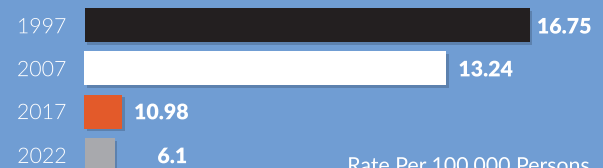


Mortality Rate for African Americans vs. White Americans⁽⁷⁾
